



**PROPOSED HOMELESSNESS SERVICES
HOUSING AND NAVIGATION CENTER**

Benton County and the City of Corvallis formed the Home, Opportunity, Planning, and Equity (HOPE) Advisory Board to address homelessness in Benton County. If passed, the proposed bond would support the implementation of a core HOPE recommendation by dedicating funds to the development of a Homelessness Navigation Center in Corvallis to help people build pathways out of homelessness.

If the bond passes, the County has allocated up to \$3 million for the Homelessness Services Housing and Navigation Center. The proposed facility is envisioned in partnership with the Corvallis Daytime Drop-in Center (CDDC) serving Benton County since 2002. Benton County has requested state funds to complete the project.

**IF THE MEASURE PASSES HOW
MUCH WOULD IT COST?**

If passed, the bond levy rate would be an estimated \$0.55 per \$1,000 of assessed property value. The cost would be an estimated \$142 per year for a Benton County home with a median tax-assessed value of \$258,596.

If the measure does not pass, facilities would not be built and property taxes would not increase.

PROGRAM INFORMATION

CDDC's vision for a Homelessness Services Housing and Navigation Center is a low-barrier, non-congregate emergency shelter open seven days per week that would connect residents with health services, permanent housing, and public benefits. Guests served would have one-stop access to service providers, case management, community spaces, basic needs navigation, healthcare, behavioral healthcare, employment resources, and affordable housing services during drop-in hours, Monday through Friday, 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM.
